AGM 2022: Report Operations & Finance Manager

At the end of 2020 I was appointed to this newly created role of 'Operations & Finance Manager'. According to the job description, the focus of this role is "To lead the parish in management of all operational, human resources, finance, and maintenance and long-term development activities of the parish."

With Liz George as Liturgy & Pastoral Coordinator, we were supposed to receive support from a third person who would be focussing on Communications. Due to the circumstances around lockdowns and the subsequently declined income, the position has not been filled.

In the meantime, Liz and I have been sharing the tasks that would have been carried out by this person.

Operations

Maintenance / Properties

- Presbytery: the building has been insulated and has received a new hot water cylinder. It now complies with all regulations for a 'Healthy Home'.
- St John's: The pathway to the school parking was redone by John Tauai. The handrails are work in progress.
- Office: In July 2021 the roof that had been leaking for several years was successfully repaired.
- St Francis: In November 2021 the carpet was replaced after following due process.

Social Media / IT-Communication

- The website is now maintained, and baptism forms and other forms are available for download from the website.
- The previous database and mailing lists have been updated and merged into one cloud-based CRM system (a more complex type of database) hosted by Infoodle.
- The rosters are now prepared on the Infoodle database and sent out directly from the system, while pdf-files of the rosters are available on the website.
- The parish has a Facebook page which was used to broadcast Mass on Facebook during lockdowns.

Strategic Working Group

This group was set up in 2021 but has been put on hold during the lockdowns. The intention is to build a group of at least one member of the PPC, at least one member of the Finance Committee and other parishioners who would like to be involved in the long-term planning for the parish.

Volunteers

We are grateful to the large number of committed volunteers. All of them are important. The volunteers who have particularly supported me on a regular basis in my work have been:

- 1. The Database Team: Jo Ramsay and Anthony Moorcroft.
- 2. The Caretakers of St Francis: Tony & Maria Jardim.
- 3. The Gardening Group with Kevin O'Carroll as my main adviser.
- 4. The Counters Group with Douglas Sinclair as the person who banks the collections.
- 5. The Facebook administrators, especially Gabriel Chao Ren.
- 6. The Safeguarding coordinator Iona Breinhorst.

Finances

Accounting

- The accounting system and payroll have been moved to the cloud and were therefore accessible during lockdowns.
- Appropriate processes are in place to review and store financial records.
- The Annual Financial Statement was prepared in cooperation with two accountants who are parishioners and volunteered to support my work. No extra fees applied.

Donations

- The donor database has been updated. As a result, the donation receipts for 2021/2022 were sent out within one week of the new Financial Year.
- A group of volunteers helped me to prepare donation envelopes for re-use. Whereas in previous years, approx. \$2,000 had to be paid every year for print and delivery of donation envelopes, there were no costs for 2021 and 2022.

Income / Expenditures

- The donations in 2021 have been similar to the one in the previous year. However, this means that the parish hasn't recovered from the substantial drop of collections since the pandemic started.
- The Statement of the Financial Performance shows a net deficit which is mainly due to: 1. High depreciation, mainly of buildings (nearly \$88,000 in 2021) which is a non-cash expense.
 - 2. Before depreciation, the P&L shows a surplus of \$12,000 (2021).

Many thanks to all parishioners who donate to the running of the parish – with their donations, prayers, contributions or with their volunteer work.

- Development of Workbook to supplement the CEC booklet, Baptizing your Baby.

- 2023 have material about our active passionate family groups to pass onto attendees encouraging them to make contact.
- Have a small selection of children's biblical books, on loan from St Joseph's store, to show as examples, of how they can enrich their children's faith at home.
- Investigate restarting a Play Group for young families.
- Keep a record of baptisms and send a card to families on the anniversary of their first baptism.

The main challenge is to meet parents where they are at. Most seeking baptism for their children are not regular with church attendance, so it is important to regard this as normal AND to encourage the parents, as first teachers, to begin small faith rituals in their home and wherever possible take their children to mass. To teach by example as well as words.

I see a good school/parish relationship to be paramount in helping with faith development.

- All Souls Candle Lighting Mass on the 2nd November brings together those who are grieving the loss of a loved one, it gives family members an opportunity to light a candle and remember.
- Parish Reconciliation for Advent and Lent.
- Coordinate / liaise with parish groups
- Tuesday morning 'catch up' at White Flower in Browns Bay has a steady following.
- Opportunity to communicate via weekly Museletta.

As we are returning to our church celebrations, post Covid we are having to:

- Look at how to reconnect with those who are not able to return to Sunday Mass
- Develop structures to be more culturally diverse, aware and encouraging. This will give us all a greater understanding of community.
- Ministry to the Sick has been difficult to maintain with many of the Rest Homes in quarantine and new regulations for Health and safety. Assisting our ministers going to private homes would help us fill our obligations.
- Communications is such an important tool in building our parish strength. We have the means to do this on multiple platforms, we need parishioners to keep us informed of any changes, either leave a message or email.

GROUP NAME	Monthly Children's Mass – St John's 9am (3rd Sunday)

*It is difficult to get enough children at the masses early enough to fill all of the roles – we end up having to double up roles only to see at communion time how many children were at mass but not early enough to be involved.

I have tried the following strategies to try to address the above.

- Notices in the church and school newsletter highlighting the time to be at the church (8:30am) in order to have a role and time to practice.
- Inviting parishioners to be on an email database to be reminded on the Friday before each monthly Children's mass.
- Speaking at 9am masses at St Johns and highlighting the Children's masses and the times to arrive and why.

- Decision made to be proactive instead of reactive.
- We began calling people referred to us by the Pastoral leader in the Parish.
- All calls have been well received.
- This action to be developed in the future to support/show caring for parishioners after bereavement or any other event such as a new baby or first communion.
- The aim being in such actions to build a stronger caring community.

The group is evolving in response to identified needs within the Parish community. Covid has interrupted plans to encourage involvement in community-based activities. The original purpose of the group to help parishioners access psychosocial support remains but does not appear to be needed at this time.

GROUP NAME	Passionist Family Group Movement
GROUP MISSION (Purpose. Only two or three sentences.)	A Family for all. The Passionist Family Group Movement aims to build Christian community through the development of extended families. Family Groups create an extended family atmosphere within the community and are open to everyone. Our focus is on people caring for, loving and accepting each other.

- Although COVID-19 restrictions minimised direct contact, many groups remained in touch through WhatsApp, TEAMS and Skype coffee dates and ongoing text check-ins.
- We have
- By joining a Passionist Family Group you will be in immediate contact with other families and people in our parish. Once you know them, you'll find you are able to meet with them after Mass instead of feeling alone. A Family Group is a great way of helping you to break down barriers if you find it difficult to talk with people.
- A Family Group is made up of 10 12 families or units, perhaps with a cross section of ages, including some children of the same age, or perhaps a number of people of similar ages and stage in life.
- Strangers become friends. Faces become names and names become family
- A Family Group is just like a family: the bonds that develop the feelings of belonging create a sense of responsibility for one another. As in any family there is sometimes the need for extra effort. As with all aspects of life, you reap what you sow. You will get from Family Groups what you put into Family Groups.
- Through the interaction with your Family Group, you will also find you are bringing a happy loving spirit to your parish. The Family Groups operate within the parish and as such are responsible for promoting the life of the parish community.
 - Experience shows that Family Groups are a great asset to the parish, since many people become actively involved in parish life.
- A recent relaunch of the family groups in the parish during September 2022, has included nine more families into existing groups. Welcome to the family!

The latest recruitment drive has seen new volunteers come forward, however there are still many areas where the volunteer list is short. In particular, the "welcoming" role struggles to be filled. Likewise, altar servers at Masses other than the 9am Mass are few and we are reliant on the same young people to fill these roles.

A number of individuals are unable to fulfil their ministry on a given day and are failing to locate a replacement. For some the reminder in the parish newsletter is not sufficient. Infoodle will help by allowing people to enter when they are unavailable and by providing 3 main rosters per year enable people to plan in advance.

We would like however the Parish Council to consider funding a reminder text message each Wednesday to those rostered at the upcoming Sunday Mass.

Eg. Remember you are rostered at Mass this weekend 🔾

We would also like consideration of sending a text message to those who do not present for their ministry on the Monday after the date that they were rostered.

Eg. If you are unable to fulfil your ministry obligation at Mass please try and arrange a replacement. If you cannot, please contact the Liturgy Coordinator as soon as possible so that alternative arrangements can be made.

Thank you to the Rostering Team (it is indeed a team effort) who work so hard behind the scenes trying to recruit and coordinate the volunteers.

The parishioners are very generous with donations of food and donations of money which are very much appreciated and keeps the foodbank reasonably well stocked. Over the past year we have given out just over 100 food parcels including Christmas hampers and gifts.

We have been able to help several pupils from various East Coast Bays schools with the finance for school uniforms, camps and other activities that otherwise the families could not afford.

We are open to assist any family/person in any way when their needs are greater than they are able to do financially or otherwise. We always appreciate information passes on to us of people who would benefit from our help.

 - Police Vetted (every 3 years)

- Include photographs of parishioners on the database and in places where recognising someone is important.
- Some sort of identifying badge in certain circumstances for volunteers.

Safeguarding was confusing for many people to start, but I am finding that having a Parish Safeguarding Coordinator is being viewed with value, in regard to the functioning of many groups and tasks, especially in situations where a third party does not offer personal offence in requiring, for instance, police vetting.

This is a background role that is supposed to cultivate a safeguarding culture within the parish community. Safeguarding looks to keep safe:

- Children up to and including 18 years old
- The elderly and vulnerable
- Anyone who does not share equal 'power' in any encounter
- The personal 'data' of parishioners
- The dignity of each parishioner

Offenses and concerns are delt with by:

- Listening and offering options
- Encouraging dialogue if appropriate
- Notification of the diocese and authorities through very clear communication channels

GROUP NAME	Social and Hospitality
