

News from the Finance Committee

The Finance Committee is currently investigating a couple of major projects:

- 1. The Presbytery
- 2. Audio-Visual Systems in both churches
- 3. Drainage improvements (St Francis)

While the projects 2 and 3 will depend on evaluating reasonable quotes and then taking decisions as good stewards, the first project is the project that has been postponed for many years.

Some parishioners might remember the dreams of a new purpose-built presbytery in the times of Fr John Webb (more than 10 years ago). As a result of these plans to replace the building, only necessary maintenance has been carried out in the presbytery since.

The Strategic Working Group and the current Finance Committee have identified two options to move towards a presbytery that is "fit for purpose":

1. Full-fledged refurbishment, incl. re-wiring and replacing all windows (and possibly the roof).

2. Replacing the current presbytery with a pre-fab building.

Both options would result in a presbytery that could accommodate 2 priests and a visitor, i.e. 3 separate ensuites and one shared living space.

Depending on the extent of renovation necessary, the replacement might be cheaper than the refurbishment.

As soon as the Finance Committee has tangible figures and plans for the presbytery, the parishioners will be invited for a Special General Meeting to decide on the way forward.

In order to tackle the big project of renewing the presbytery, it will be paramount to have the support of the parishioners. We invite you to start fundraising for the presbytery. We have a special bank account for Fundraising activities. The donations to this account will be used only for the purposes that you identify in your reference, e.g. **Reference: Presbytery**

Passionist Family Group







Invitation to the Friendship Craft & Coffee Group


East Coast Bays parish is a caring community and as part of its work to promote friendship and support for parishioners, the **Friendship Craft and Coffee Group** was developed.

Baptism Preparation—next course: 13 Feb 2024

The course has 3 aims:

1. To provide an opportunity where families can come aside from the busyness of their day to focus on this special milestone and to prepare for it through discussion and reflection.



2. To connect families whose child is being welcomed into the church.
 3. To look at the origins of Baptism, the church's teaching on Baptism and the role parents have as first educators.

Baptisms are held at 11.00am on the 1st Saturday of the month at St John's and the 3rd Saturday of the month at St Francis's. There are no baptisms during Lent. The baby/child is presented to the church at a Vigil or Sunday Mass prior to the baptism. Baptism preparation courses are held regularly throughout the year.
